#### <u>Presentation of Annual Accounts (TT)</u>

### SPLTC Treasurer's Report Year ending 31.09.2023

Club Funds have increased by £8,000 this year and now stand at £50,882. Of this £45,000 is on deposit at 3.2% which will mature on  $28^{th}$  May 2024. This FY is the  $1^{st}$  in a long time that we've been able to earn any interest, and did earn £494 in interest this year.

We also had extra income of £ 351 from Karen's quiz which ran in June. Income from memberships remains our most significant income stream and had remained strong. Junior numbers have increased significantly, albeit from a very low base.

General spending has increased, up about £1,300 if you exclude the one-off cost last year of the extra floodlights. Of this £800 was spent on the new kitchen and roughly £500 on new nets. As always Mark and the maintenance team have done a great job of keeping costs down.

I have a quote for court resurfacing which was £78,000 (including VAT). At the current rate we should have this available in 3 to 4 years, so should be in good shape when the courts need resurfacing.

## Subscriptions 2023/24

TT proposed ,and the meeting agreed, to not increase subscription costs this year, so they will remain the same for the 2023/24 season and reviewed again at the next AGM.

- a) Membership (Anne Milne)

  Anne was absent from the meeting and there was no report
- b) Men's Captain (DB)

2023 another very successful and fun year for SPLTC Men.

- Thursday nights are consistently well attended with fun and competitive tennis utilising 'fast 4 format'. Open for all to participate with most players at intermediate standard.
- New Singles Box league has been well attended with 4<sup>th</sup> round recently underway consisting of 3 divisions & 25+ players. Special thanks to Mark for organizing this excellent initiative.
- We only managed a single 'Beer & Samosa' social tournament this summer and actually had more social Cricket matches. But the format will be back next year please, Roger.
- Finally, we have organised three rounds of 'Advance Doubles Coaching' through Stephen with Tim. These accelerated 4-week formats have been very helpful improving the club's competitive doubles match play.

## c) Ladies' Captain (TT)

The ladies' vets fielded one team in the winter vets 22/23 season, which finished  $4^{th}$  in division 3. This is a very tight division, with 8 ladies representing the team.

1st place = 28 points

The ladies fielded two teams in the summer 2023:

Ladies 1 in Division 2 – finished  $2^{nd}$  and should be promoted back to division 1 (3 wins, 1 draw and 1 defeat)

This team consists of 6 ladies.

Ladies 2 in division 9 - finished  $5^{th}$  out of 6, winning 12 rubbers across 5 matches. 10 ladies played for this team across the course of the season.

All teams were well supported with some pairings beginning to establish themselves in the second team.

This is my last season as ladies captain and I would like to thank everyone for their fantastic support and making the job so easy.

## d) <u>Mixed Teams' Captains</u> (non-committee)

# i) <u>MX1</u>(FD)

Winter 2022/23 Division 1. After very competitive tennis against clubs much larger than SP we finished  $5^{th}$  out of 7. This was good enough to keep us in division 1 this winter so well done all who played, sometimes in very wet and cold conditions.

Summer 2023.

Again, we played in division 1. You cannot get any higher, so a very well done to our team for being good enough to play in division 1. Other, larger clubs have far more players, many of whom are coaches and county players, who play for their mixed first teams. We do not have that luxury. Unfortunately, even though we played our very best players, we were not able to gain any wins, so finished bottom of division 1. However, we did come close on some occasions! Thank you to all players who played in the winter and summer leagues. They are Finella, Grace, Karen, Triona, Falco, Phil C, Phil N, Bernado, Masa and Frank.

## ii) <u>MX2 (PN)</u>

We finished 5<sup>th</sup> of 8 with 6 points, following 2 wins, 2 draws and 3 defeats. The team consisted of 14 players for this season.

### iii) <u>MX3</u>(RP)

Once again, our 3rd team delivered some excellent results, giving our opponents very completive games.

We managed to involve many new and old members giving Will his first taste of Club match play. Another important achievement was we had seven different ladies and seven men representing the team, which bodes well for the future of the Club.

## e) <u>Safeguarding</u> (DS)

Fortunately, this year we have had no safeguarding issues.

Only two accidents have been recorded in the accident book and there have been no repercussions from either incident.

Although we are still looking for more member who are first aid trained, a number have come forward (Finella, Cath) or been identified (Khalid). In April, the LTA conducted an unannounced safeguarding check. This is a requirement of our registration. All elements on the website and at the clubhouse that are required were found to be in place and because of this we passed our safeguarding check.

The LTA now requires several additional policies to be in place. I have worked on these to adapt them for our venue. Current policies have been reviewed and updated. The whistle blowing policy has now been subsumed into the safeguarding policy and the additional four policies have now been put into place. These will all be uploaded and put on the website.

On a final note, please may I remind everyone that all members are responsible for safeguarding at this club. Any concern should always be brought to my attention and I will deal with them as appropriate.

## i) Juniors (KP)

There has not been an active Junior Organiser for some time so I organised a Junior tournament in June for our Junior members, which was well attended, competitive and successful. Thanks to adult members who helped umpire: Pam, Triona and Roger which really helped.

Following the tournament, I started a supervised session for junior members which takes place on Wednesdays. This is well attended - there is a core group who attend every week.

Help is appreciated but not essential. I will continue with this through the winter if there is continued interest.

Today, I am standing as JO, a position I held 15 years ago. If elected, I will work closely with SW, our Head Coach and hold more tournaments, including our Junior Finals Day. If you look at the honours boards you will see that this has not been competed for some time. On that note, the club is buying a new Junior's trophy, in honour of Terry Stock.

Membership: currently there are 36 juniors, ranging from aged 5 to 17.

- k) Coaching (SW Head Coach)

Good afternoon, everyone. Here is an update from the Coaching side of the club:

## 1) Adult Coaching;

Tim Monday adult beginners/intermediates and team practice - Men's and now mixed

Stoke Poges Tennis Club members also benefit from members coaching rates at Chalfont St. Peter and Wraysbury Tennis Club if they would like lesson at either of these clubs.

### 2) Junior Development and Summer Camps

We ran a very popular and successful summer holiday camp with 20 children booked on over the course of the week

Saturday coaching running well with roughly 20 players receiving coaching each week between the ages of 5 to 16 years old.

We also run junior coaching sessions on Mondays for the 9 to 12-year-old age group and there are 8 players attending this class each week.

Our junior programme is very successful now and this has resulted in many new junior members to the club. Most of these juniors from Farnham Common Tennis Club followed me

We still do not have a link with a local school however if we did, this would help the junior programme and membership further.

## 3) Committee

I'm pleased to see that we have so many 'do-ers' on the Stoke Poges Tennis Club committee and this really does make the difference between an average club and a proactive, engaging and community-based club. There are too many names to mention but you know who you are and the club members really appreciates the hours you all devote to this wonderful village tennis club.
